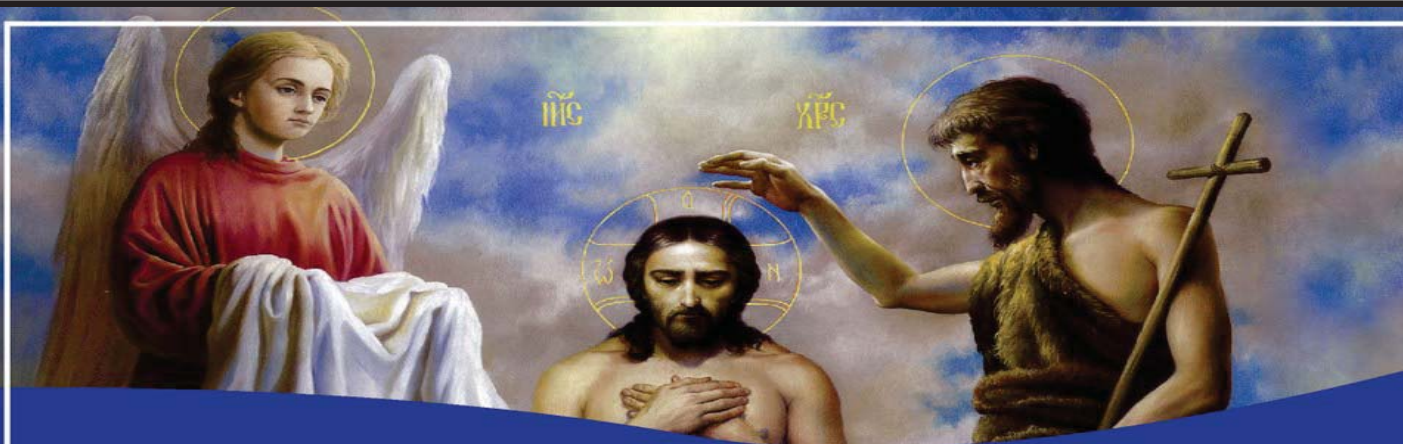

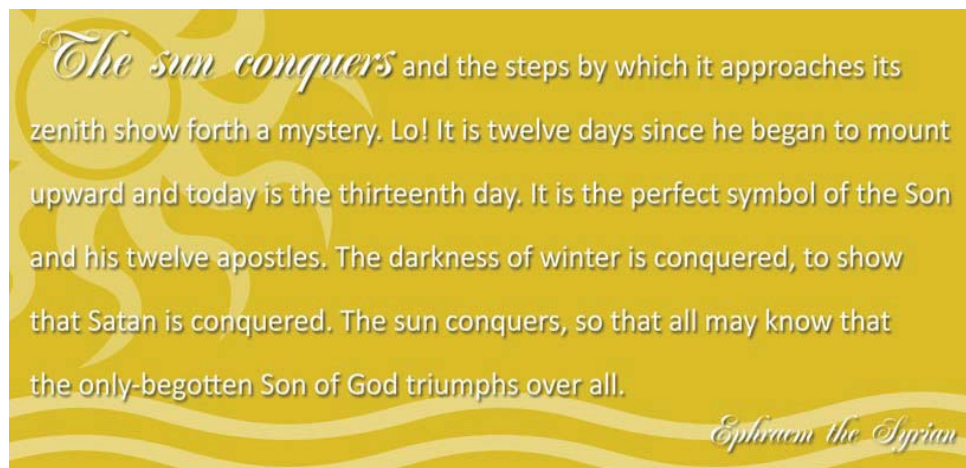

The Origin and Foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus

The Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist—are the foundations of the Christian life. “Baptism, the Eucharist, and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the ‘sacraments of Christian initiation,’ whose unity must be safeguarded” (CCC, no. 1285). We begin with our study of Baptism in this chapter and will treat the other two Sacraments in the following ones.

Baptism is birth into the new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord’s will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism.—
CCC, no. 1277

In his dialogue with Nicodemus, Jesus taught that Baptism was necessary for salvation. “No one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit” (Jn 3:5). After his Resurrection, Jesus met with the eleven Apostles and gave them the commission to preach the Gospel and baptize, telling them, “Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved” (Mk 16:16). The word *baptism* in its origins is Greek and means “immersion” and “bath.” Immersion in water is a sign of death, and emersion out of the water means new life. To bathe in water is also to undergo cleansing. St. Paul sums up this truth when he says, “You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead” (Col 2:12).



The origin and foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus. Before starting his public ministry, Jesus submitted himself to the baptism given by John the Baptist. The waters did not purify him; he cleansed the waters. “He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake . . . to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water” (St. Gregory Nazianzen, *Liturgy of the Hours*, I, 634). Jesus’ immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God’s will. Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free from sin. However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which people would die to sin—Original and actual—and begin to live a new life with God.

El Origen y el Cimiento del Bautismo Cristiano es Jesús

Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación —Bautismo, Confirmación y la Eucaristía— son los cimientos de la vida cristiana. “Con el Bautismo y la Eucaristía, el sacramento de la Confirmación constituye el conjunto

de los ‘sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana’, cuya unidad debe ser salvaguardada” (CIC, no. 1285). Comenzamos en este capítulo con el estudio del Bautismo y trataremos los otros dos sacramentos en los

capítulos siguientes.

El Bautismo constituye el nacimiento a la vida nueva en Cristo. Según la voluntad del Señor, es necesario para la salvación, como lo es la Iglesia misma, a la que introduce el Bautismo.—CIC, no. 1277

En su diálogo con Nicodemo, Jesús enseñó que el Bautismo era necesario para la salvación. “El que no nace del agua y del Espíritu no puede entrar en el Reino de Dios” (Jn 3:5). Tras su Resurrección, Jesús se encontró con los once Apóstoles y les confirió la misión de predicar el Evangelio y de bautizar, diciéndoles: “El que crea y se bautice, se salvará” (Mc 16:16). La palabra bautismo proviene del griego y significa “sumergir” y “baño”. Sumergirse en el agua es un signo de muerte, y emerger del agua significa una vida nueva. Bañarse en el agua también es experimentar una limpieza. San Pablo resume esta verdad cuando dice: “Por el Bautismo fueron ustedes sepultados con Cristo y también resucitaron

con él, mediante la fe en el poder de Dios, que lo resucitó de entre los muertos” (Col 2:12).

El origen y el cimiento del Bautismo cristiano es Jesús. Antes de comenzar su ministerio público, Jesús se sometió a sí mismo al bautizo que celebraba Juan el Bautista. Las aguas no purificaron a Jesús; Jesús purificó las aguas. “Antes de nosotros y por nosotros, el que era espíritu y carne santifica el Jordán, para así iniciarnos por el Espíritu y el agua en los sagrados misterios” (San Gregorio Nacianceno, Liturgia de las Horas, vol. I, 259). La inmersión de Jesús en las aguas del Jordán es un signo, para todos los seres humanos, de la necesidad de morir a nosotros mismos para hacer la voluntad de Dios. Jesús no tenía necesidad de ser bautizado porque era totalmente fiel a la voluntad de su Padre y estaba libre de pecado. Sin embargo, quiso mostrar su solidaridad con los seres humanos para así reconciliarlos con el Padre. Al conferir a los discípulos la misión de bautizar a todas las naciones, Jesús estableció el medio por el cual la gente pone fin al pecado —Original y actual—y empieza a vivir una nueva vida con Dios.
